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Education4Sustainable Schools 2030 aims to contribute towards a fairer and more sustainable world through strengthening sustainable education in schools within the countries of the River Nile with the overall aim of furthering the achievement of the 17 SDGs.

The objective of this program is to incorporate sustainable education and the 17 SDGs into policies, learning environments, educational resources, promoting the empowerment and mobilization of local level action.

This resource forms part of the Nile citizen science program to promote education, communication, participation and awareness of sustainability and ecosystem restoration, which was designed and developed by the CEO NET Africa.

The resource was developed in response to several global calls to action including the UN Decade on ecosystem restoration, the Global Education 2030 agenda, and the School Meals Coalition.

The goals and objectives of the Education4Sustainable Schools 2030 program is part of the Education for Sustainable Development 2030 a global movement to eradicate poverty through the 17 Sustainable Development Goals by 2030, championed by the Education for Sustainable Development 2030 lead by UNESCO who have delivered and supported many successful projects similar to this program.

The Education4Sustainable Schools 2030 is launching at a time the world is still battling with the COVID-19 pandemic that spread across the planet in 2020. affecting every aspect of our lives, and one that has revealed the fragility of our interconnected dependence with nature. We have learned that as forests are destroyed, wild animals endangered, and ecosystems weakened.
